From Pastor Tyler

"Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness," Luke 4:1

Each season of Lent is greeted with an account from one of the synoptic gospels of Jesus being driven into the wilderness for forty days and forty nights. This is fitting, as the forty days of Lent are meant to remind us and represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Nearly two years ago, we entered a wilderness of our own. We entered this pandemic without knowing how long the journey would be, only that God was with us. When we approached difficult decisions, God was guiding us. When we felt isolated and alone, Christ's love showed up in the form of the care and concern of family, friends, and neighbors. We have come this far by faith, led in the wilderness of life by Christ's guiding hand.

As our normal lives slowly begin to return, the memory of that which was taken away from us for so long still lingers. So, if you are considering taking on a Lenten practice, rather than giving something up for Lent, I would suggest taking up a Lenten practice. Be it a more intentional prayer schedule, or the giving of alms, or service in the community – I suggest taking up a spiritual discipline rather than giving something up this year. Perhaps, one of the Lenten practices you can take up is attending our midweek compline services?

One of the things I missed most dearly throughout the pandemic was singing with others, so what a blessing it is to be called to a church with such talented musicians and staff! Clearly, we are a church that loves to sing and appreciates music. So, as I reflected upon our theme for our midweek services, I wondered how we might incorporate our shared loved of music as a congregation and celebrate our ability to once again gather and praise God in-person.

Certainly, singing our cherished hymns can lift us up out of the depths of despair, inspire us to action, and service, and even inscribe God's Word upon our hearts. So, for this year's midweek worship we are inviting members of Bethlehem to share their favorite hymns with us and to reflect upon the meaning and comfort they find within the verses. I am calling this year's midweek worship series, "Then Sings my Soul," a quote from the hymn How Great Thou Art, as we share and reflect upon the powerful ways God has worked within our lives through music.

I look forward to seeing you at one of our soup suppers and I look forward to hearing your reflections – I hope you will join us.

Blessings to each of you on your Lenten journey to the cross of Christ.



At Bethlehem we have many opportunities to share what we have with others throughout the year. This is true especially during Lent.

Meals on Wheels and the YWCA of Sonoma County will be the 2 recipients of our Lenten Offerings. Meals on Wheels helps seniors stay in their homes, maintaining their independence and happiness. A daily check by a Meals on Wheels driver allows monitoring for potential problems, falls and accidents. When a senior signs up for Meals on Wheels, they also receive access to other programs operated by Council on Aging including Social Services, Financial Services, Legal Services, Care & Case Management, Senior Peer Support, and Adult Day Social Programs.

The YWCA of Sonoma County operates the community's ONLY 24/7 Crisis Hotline for victims of domestic violence and provides emergency shelter, advocacy, resources and therapy support. The YWCA offers the only therapeutic preschool, A Special Place, for 3-5 year-old's in Sonoma County.

In your pack of offering envelopes, there is one envelope for each week marked Lenten Offering, which can be filled and sent back to church. If you don't have the envelope pack, just send a check to BLC marked for Lent. You also have the option to make an online offering by going to the church's website and clicking on Giving Options and selecting GivePlus and Lenten Offerings. Please consider making Lenten Offerings this year.

Lenten Flours (not Flowers)

Beginning on March 6 and throughout the season of Lent, BLC adorns the altar with non-perishable food items rather than flowers. Each week this bounty is taken to the F.I.S.H. Pantry where it is distributed to those who need it.

A Sign-up to bring a bag or two of groceries is posted on the kiosk in the narthex, just as if you were signing up for flowers. If possible, please place them in the baskets near the altar. Or you can also participate by bringing a few items to donate each week to the wagon in the narthex.

What a great way to celebrate "hunger no more" during the season of Lent. Our goal is to collect **1000 pounds** of food during Lent and we will share updates. Food bags are available in the narthex.



Zoom Hosts


